



Reports for games of Sept. 15

3-4 GREEN

Lincoln 38, Tigard Green 7

On Saturday, third/fourth-grade Tigard Youth Football Green team fell 38-7 to Lincoln Black. Improvements from their week 1 performance were made on both sides of the ball. They were more aggressive and disruptive on defense. The offense increased their total yardage, and put together a drive lasting nearly an entire quarter of play.

Tyler Critchfield turned in a total 43 yards rushing including a 31 yard run to the end zone, led by key blocks from Austin Wilson and Jordan Fullerton. Two of Christopher Bates' 9 yards came on a successful extra point conversion, leading the way was Samuel Larson, with the hit of the day. Kyle Nottingham rushed for 5 yards. Brady Bjorkman totaled 26 yards, many of which were provided by the blocking efforts of Andrew Jackson. Zachary Stevenson ran for 21 yards, most of those were up the gut with help from Tasrif Khan, playing center on the offensive line. Parker Chiapuzio improvised on several occasions to tally 10 yards. Jonathan Meusch managed a 6 yard contribution, while Joseph Hungerford snuck in 3 more running for daylight on a busted play.

On defense, impressive showings by Zachary Stevenson, Tyler Critchfield, and Brady Bjorkman are becoming a mainstay on the squad, making 5, 4, and 3 tackles respectively. Matthew Hockman sacked Lincoln's quarterback shortly after tackling their running back for a loss on a previous play. Dante Friesen found himself taking down ball carriers on three separate plays. Samuel Nihill and Tasrif Khan also provided solo tackles. Another tackle behind the line of scrimmage was made by Luke Benedict.

3-4 WHITE

Tigard White 22, Scappoose Orange 0

This was a tough road win for the third/fourth-grade Tigard White team against Scappoose Orange on Saturday..

Jack Barnes, a returning fourth grader, scored two touchdowns and Scott Ostrom scored one. Jack Vanderbilt was successful on two of the Point-After attempts. Big contributors on offense were Cole Harrington and Beau Paiva. A first year fourth grader, Aaron Taylor, and Donoavan Cortez-Tamez were the most improved offensive players this week.

The following line backers made some crucial plays: Zeth Buitron, Jack Vanderbilt, Scott Ostrom, Jack Chimenti, Cole Harrington, Drew McClelland, and Jack Barnes. Thanks to the effort of the Tigard White defensive players, Scappoose Orange was unable to score. Jack Chimenti made an

5-6 GREEN

Tigard Green 32, Oregon City 0

The Tigard fifth/sixth-grade Green offense struck early to get things started Saturday morning. Early in the Tigers first possession, running back Brian Pete cut back behind blocks from Paul Vickers, Janak Ward, and Chance Callaway, and raced 63 yards for a touchdown.

Thereafter, the Tigers offensive line and running back Josh Miller took over. In the second quarter, Miller scored on a 1-yard dive. In the third quarter, Miller followed up a 41 yard run down the sideline by catching an 8 yard touchdown pass from JT Greenough.

Tigard's scoring on offense was complete with a 40-yard touchdown run by Brian Pete in the fourth quarter.

With the additional efforts of Roman Mori, Tyler Walker, Kyle Baldes, Travis Kamerer and Bradley Williams, Tigard rushed for a total of 262 yards. The snapper / holder / kicker combo of David Brugato, Roman Mori and Ryan Bay was a perfect 3 for 3 in PATs.

On defense, the Tigers slowed Oregon City's passing attack with a steady rush from Jake Dettra and great coverage from Alex Kelly, Jordan Haire and Peter Bauer. Pioneer drives late in the game were stopped with spectacular interceptions by Thomas Vickers and Tyler Walker.

Tigard White 19, Tualatin Cardinal 6

The Tigard White fifth/sixth-grade team faced a tough, quick, and aggressive Tualatin Cardinal Team, yet pulled together as team for a 19-6 victory.

Zack Vollstedt led the Tigard running attack with several long runs including a touchdown. Cameron Yarnell earned tough yards through a stingy and aggressive defensive front. The Tigard White Tiger Defense had several behind the line of scrimmage sacks and tackles. Jacob Mullen, Joe Lobbato, and Cameron Yarnell led the defense. Jett Even and Ray Barlow also

contributed solid solo and gang tackling throughout the day. Ryan Cleveland, Zach Vollstedt, and Michael Andreas also contained, contributed on tackles, and covered wide outs from their Cornerback positions. Jacob Spadafora and Jake Sanders also made spectacular touchdown saving tipped passes on the day. Ryan Cleveland and Ray Barlow also intercepted passes at critical times during the game. Tigard Black fifth/sixth-grade team beat Beaverton Orange 41-12 on Tigard's home field on Saturday. The Tigard team dominated the line of scrimmage on offense and defense with a tuff, hard hitting style of play.

The offense was lead by the running of Manu Reassumes with 137 yards gained and 3 touchdowns and Landon Floyd with 155 yards gained and 2 touchdowns. Braxton Latt added another touchdown on a tough 5 yard run. Tigard's runners hit the hole hard and fast and once they are through the line of scrimmage they pull away with their sprinters speed. The offense line of Brenden Rude, Matt Hilliard, Jake Biglow, Bradley Imai, Michael Roberts, Derek Pond and Brandon Long controlled the line of scrimmage opening up huge holes for the running backs.

The offense line is well coached and very smart picking up the right blocking schemes and assignments. The Tigard JV White Tigers lost their first game of the season in Canby 33-7.

In a hard fought first half it was a battle of field position. Tigard had the first possession but struggled to run the ball effectively. After one first down and an incomplete pass the Tigers were forced to punt. Canby scored quickly and led 7-0 early. On Tigard's second possession the running game got back on track as the Tigers rushed the ball nine times for a total of 37 yards. When Canby loaded the box to stop the run the Tigard coaches called a brilliant pass play up the middle of the field that went for 31 yards as QB Taylor "TC" Courtney hit WR Evan Garrison in stride for a long gain. Canby held though, and the Tigers turned the ball over on downs. Canby scored again but Connor Olson blocked the extra point kick to leave the score 13-0.

On the Tigers next series Benny Wick got a great block from the offensive line and sprang a 55 yard touchdown run. Tigard faked an extra point kick and ran an option to the left side and Wick punched it in to bring the score to 13-7. The Tigard defense had their hands full as Canby mixed passing plays with long runs to stretch the defense and control the ball most of the second half. The defense put up 40 tackles with contributions by Aaron Andrus, Chandler Kelly, Andrew Hungerford, Justin Evans, Zach Tamez, Ethan Lange, Shane Lepper, Logan Charboneau and Clay VanRiper.

VARSDITY GREEN

Sherwood 24, Tigard Varsity Green 22

Two of the top teams in the division faced off Saturday in a key early season match up between Tigard Varsity Green and Sherwood Varsity Red. After jumping to a 24-6 lead, Sherwood held on to win 24-22.

On the opening kickoff a strong runback by Brady Watts set up Tigard with good field position on their own 41 yard line. Watts then took it up the middle twice to notch a Tigard first down in Sherwood territory. Two hard fought runs by Brandon Dettra gained 7 yards and helped set up the defense for the next play by Adam Holman. Holman took an inside handoff, broke a tackle then sprinted past the linebackers on his way to a 44-yard touchdown.

Sherwood would later gain momentum. Facing third down and 3 to go, Sherwood ran an off tackle play to perfection. Blocking was precise and their running back broke free for a 73 yard touchdown run. Their PAT kick was good and just like that the score was Sherwood 8, Tigard 6. A Tigard fumble at the 18-yard line helped set up Sherwood's next score. Four plays after the turnover Sherwood punched it in for a TD. The 2 point conversion was good and put Sherwood ahead 16 – 6.

After coming up with an interception, Sherwood looked as though they had secured the win when they broke a run for a 75 yard touchdown on their first play following the turnover. With a good kick they now lead 24–6 with only 4:24 left in the game.

The Tigers had been moving the ball well, but their mistakes had been costly. Now they took the field down 18 points late in the fourth quarter. Niko Freni's return to the 50 got things started. A bullet pass to Robert Stry's gained 10 and another sweep by Harrison Bruce added 32 more. Brady Watts got a block by Jeremy Moore to move it to the 1 yard line and Freni punched it in on a keeper from there. Andre Metternich's 2 point kick was good and Tigard now trailed 24 – 14, but they were running out of time. Tigard kept their hopes alive when Stry's made an incredible catch at the sideline on the onside kick and gave Tigard back the ball.

Sweeps by Freni and Watts both picked up first downs and moved the ball to the Sherwood 20. Freni then scampered up the sideline to the 7 to set up first and goal. A pass to Watts moved them to the one and again Freni followed the line into the end zone on a keeper. Metternich's kick was good and with less than a minute to play Tigard was only down two at 22 – 24. With the last successful onside kick in their minds, Tigard knew they could recover another, but Sherwood finally secured the game when they made an athletic catch to control the kick.
